

# The John C. Mascaro Faculty Programs in Sustainability

Application Deadline: Friday, February 23, 2024 Awardees Announced: April 15, 2024 Funds Distributed: May-June 2024 Reports Due: May 2025

The Mascaro Center for Sustainable Innovation (MCSI) is pleased to announce our <u>John C. Mascaro Faculty Programs</u> in Sustainability. All Faculty are eligible to apply for Faculty Fellowships, Scholarships, and or Lectureships in Sustainability. The John C. Mascaro Faculty program is designed to enhance the university's mission of interdisciplinary excellence in sustainability research and education. Faculty members from ALL disciplines across ALL campuses of the University of Pittsburgh are encouraged to apply.

Each award will be one year in duration. John C. Mascaro Fellowships and Scholarships awardees are eligible to apply for an additional support the following year. All Faculty in the John C. Mascaro programs are invited to think creatively about contributing to the Sustainability mission of the Mascaro Center.

#### John C. Mascaro Faculty Fellowships (\$15,000):

John C. Mascaro Faculty Fellowships provide support for faculty seeking to incorporate sustainability at the **University level (across schools and disciplines) and or in partnership with significant external stakeholders**. Faculty interested in the fellowship should demonstrate how their proposal will support or expand university-wide *sustainability education* programs and or catalyze growth in the University's *sustainability research* portfolio.

## John C. Mascaro Faculty Scholarships (\$10,000):

John C. Mascaro Faculty Scholarships provide support for faculty seeking to incorporate sustainability education and or research at the **Pitt college/school level or into their discipline**. Faculty interested in the Scholarship level should demonstrate how their proposal will support *interdisciplinary sustainability education* programs in a Pitt school/college and or catalyze growth in *sustainability research* in their school and or field.

## John C. Mascaro Faculty Lectureships (up to \$5,000):

John C. Mascaro Faculty Lectureships provide support for Faculty looking to incorporate Sustainability into a **Class or program** or jumpstart a new initiative. Faculty interested in the Lectureship level should demonstrate how their proposal will engage students in sustainability.

# Examples of successful initiatives include, but are not limited to:

Partnerships and Initiatives that provide unique experiences for our faculty and students and build capacity and community around MCSI's sustainability <u>research themes</u> (see below)

- Creating co-taught inter-disciplinary courses
- Bridging undergraduate research programs to incorporate sustainability
- Leading interdisciplinary project proposals (research, education, community engagement)
- Developing sustainability focused research or education workshops
- Creating or transitioning a current class to be an **on-line** Sustainability-focused course
- Creating a Sustainability Elective for a course or program that meets the Sustainability-focused or Sustainability-related <u>Academic Attributes</u> in our <u>Sustainability Education programs</u> (e.g. Sustainability certificate, M.S. Sustainable Engineering, Sustainability Distinction).
- Designing and offering Sustainability curriculum workshops
- Building external partnerships with industry, gov't, NGOs related to addressing Sustainability Challenges
- Directing <u>service learning</u> activities (including leading community engagement projects and developing sustained partnerships with community organizations)

# **Application Requirements**

# Eligibility

All University of Pittsburgh faculty are eligible to apply. Faculty are highly encouraged to discuss their ideas with the MCSI leadership team.

# Budgets

Awards will be announced in April and funds distributed in May/June Spring 2024. Funds can be used for salary, undergraduate and graduate student support, post-doctoral support, course release, equipment, supplies and travel.

# **Proposal Cover**

- Pl's name, affiliation and contact information (campus address, phone number and email address)
- Proposal Level to which you are applying (i.e. Fellowship, Scholarship, Lectureship)
- 100 Word Abstract

# **Body of the Proposal**

The body of the proposal should not exceed **three single-spaced pages** and should employ a 12-point font size and oneinch margins. The body of the proposal should address:

- 1. How does incorporating Sustainability into your work fit into your long term professional goals as a faculty member?
- 2. How will the proposed actions and directions jumpstart a new concept or tie into your work to date?
- 3. How will your research (if relevant for your proposal) enhance sustainability in your discipline and or across disciplines?
- 4. How will your proposal accelerate MCSI's mission of Research, Education and Engagement?
  - a. If applicable, How will your proposed activities enhance the student experience in university-wide sustainability programs?
  - b. If applicable, How will your proposed activities catalyze growth in the university's sustainability research portfolio?

## Appendices

- The PI should include a CV (2 page maximum)
  - Attach Letter(s) of endorsement. A one-page letter of endorsement from your department chair/supervisor is required. If appropriate, a letter of support from a community partner organization should also be included.

# Important Submission instructions

## Proposals are due February 23, 2024

In a single-PDF please include (Proposal Cover Page, Body of the Proposal, Budget, Chair/Supervisor Letter, and CV) Your single PDF File should be named *LastNameFacFellow2024*.

Your single PDF File should be submitted via our Qualtrics Form

Proposals are reviewed by a committee of internal and external advisors.

## **Reporting Requirements:**

Recipients of an award from the JCM Faculty program must fulfill the following requirements:

- Three to five PowerPoint slides summarizing the goals and outcome of the work due on May 1, 2025.
- Acknowledgement of MCSI funding in any publications resulting from the work.
